Pastor's Notes

"...The Heartbeat of the Church"

Here is a riddle for you, "What is the easiest thing we can do for the church that we do not do because it is so hard?" The answer to come a little later.

I don't normally mention new Sermon Series in the newsletter, and while every message is important, this one is at the heart of all that we do. The series and the answer to the riddle are really the same, the answer is... prayer.

I am titling the series: "Prayer, the Heartbeat of the Church". Because I think that is what prayer is. It is the thing that is as foundational to the life of Christians as the heart is to the body. It is also the power behind the life of the church. It is through prayer that the life-giving power of the Spirit flows through the people of God to do the life-giving work of God.

Prayer is not a magic formula. There is no one-to-one correspondence between my prayers and God's answers. That is a simplistic and wrong understanding of

Prayer. Prayer instead is developing a relationship with God and allowing that relationship to open up pathways for God to use you for His glory.

If we take this sermon series seriously, if we take prayer seriously, it will enable us to experience the great things God has in plan for St. John's. In Jeremiah 29:11 God states "For I know the plans I have for you ... plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

And yet, prayer, though so simple to do, is hard, as anyone who has seriously attempted it can tell you. It takes dedication to continue when we pray and don't see answers to those prayers. To trust that God will hear and to trust his response. All that is hard, but may we become more dedicated to it, because it is the heartbeat of the church.
